Term 1: Playful Toys

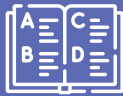

Term 1: Animal Wellbeing & Myths



Build your awareness of how we can protect animals with the thinking unit and read the emotive advocacy and stories of animals around the world and throughout history. Students will write their own persuasive essays to argue for animals that are under our care with carefully crafted arguments that articulate logic and emotion. They will follow up with a project to create a mystical narrative that celebrates our relationship with the animals by practicing the techniques found in writing fables and fiction.

Students will imagine the next advancements in investigative technology to empower law enforcement and write an instructional manual for them. Term 1: Survival & Growth

Term 2: Writing for the World

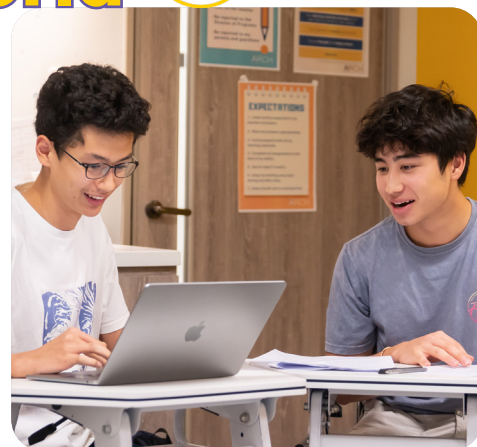
